Beverley Ebersold serves as the Director of National Initiatives at the United States Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH), a principal representative and bridge between the work of the full Council and states and communities. Over the past three years, she has served as a USICH Regional Coordinator, convening stakeholders at every level of government and with the private sector, encouraging implementation of strategies that maximize the impact of Federal resources and supporting strategic planning efforts.



Beverley has extensive experience in supportive housing development, service design, delivery and coordination, working with Continuums of Care, and building local partnerships to end homelessness. Her previous background includes coordinating blended management for a supportive housing non-profit developer, serving as program director of a homeless shelter, and providing supported education for persons with psychiatric disabilities. She has experience in capacity building and technical assistance with HUD grantees, strategic planning and restructuring of Continuums of Care, and convening stakeholders to promote the alignment of resources for persons experiencing homelessness, with an emphasis on permanent supportive housing. She has a Master's Degree in Social Work with a concentration in Community Organizing & Administration from Wayne State University.
